

English Road Pediatrics and Adolescent Medicine Schedule of Well-child Care and Immunizations

The physicians at English Road Pediatrics recommend childhood vaccination according to the most current recommendations by the American Academy of Pediatrics and the CDC. Completion of this series ensures immunity against serious childhood diseases and will fulfill the immunization requirements for area schools. More information regarding immunizations is provided at each well-child visit. If you would like to discuss concerns about immunizing your child, talk with your pediatrician.

First visit: 1 – 2 days after discharged from the hospital

Second visit: 2 weeks of age

Third visit: 5 weeks of age

Fourth visit: 2 months old

Fifth visit: 4 months old

Sixth visit: 6 months old

Seventh visit: 9 months old

Eighth visit: 1 year old

Ninth visit: 15 months old

Tenth visit: 18 months old

Eleventh visit: 2 years old

Twelfth visit: 2 ½ years old

Visits are then yearly during your child's birthday month, until the age of 18.

Vaccination Schedule

You'll be busy getting to know your baby and your pediatrician in the first 2 years when the visits are more frequent. These vaccines keep our children healthy when they are the most vulnerable to severe illness.

Birth (in Hospital) or at First Visit- Hepatitis B

5 weeks- Hepatitis B

2 month- Dtap, Polio, Pneumococcal, HiB, Rotavirus

4 month- Dtap, Polio, Pneumococcal, HiB, Rotavirus

6 month- Dtap, Pneumococcal, HiB (Influenza vaccine in season)

9 month- Hepatitis B

12 month- Pneumococcal, Hepatitis A, HiB Hemoglobin and Lead level in office

15 month- MMR, Varicella

18 month- Dtap, Polio, Hepatitis A

2 years - Hemoglobin & Lead Level in office

3 years- yearly well child visit, no shots

4 or 5 years – DtaP, Polio, MMR, Varicella

6 - 9 years – yearly well child visits, no shots

10 years – Tdap Lipid Profile test in office

11 years – Meningococcal ACWY, HPV first dose (second dose due 6-12 months after first dose)

12 - 15years – yearly well child visits, no shots

16 years – Meningococcal ACWY, Meningitis B first dose (second dose due one month after first dose)

17 years – Lipid Profile test in office

18 – 22 years- yearly well child visits & transition to adult medicine

* yearly flu shots are available to all children over the age of 6 months.

(DTap- diphtheria, tetanus, and Pertussis vaccine. HiB – vaccine for Haemophilus Influenza Type B. MMR - Measles, Mumps, Rubella vaccine. Varicella – chicken pox vaccine).
